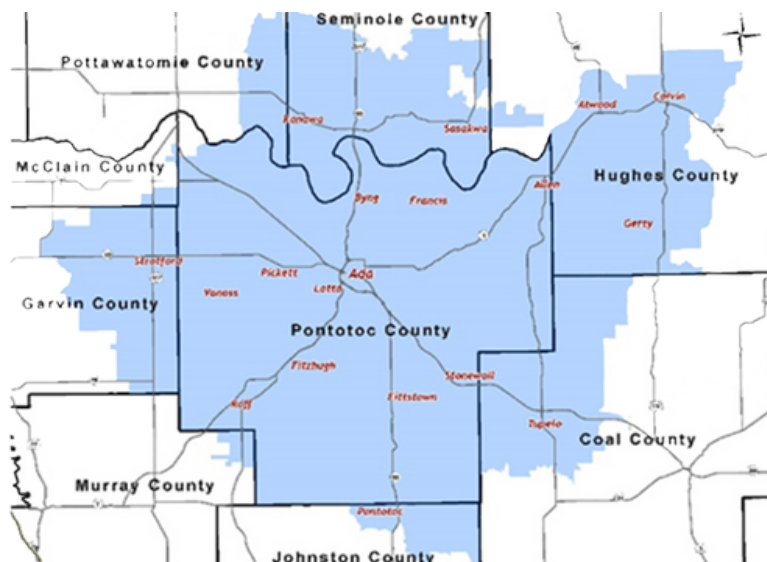

# OUR IMPACT AGENCIES

At Ada Regional United Way, we are UNITED IN PURPOSE with local agencies addressing the needs in the community. In 2022 your donor dollars helped 16 agencies, 21 programs within these agencies, and a community investment program:

# OUR COMMUNITY IMPACT

In partnering with our funded agencies, Ada Regional United Way was able to help our community:

- Serve over 69,000 meals with some days being in the excess of 300 meals in one day
- Shelter 535 those without a home
- Obtain permanent housing for 217 homeless households
- Prevent 483 households from being evicted
- Fill up a community food pantry
- Empower youth with leadership, life and community skills
- Support individuals with Senior Adult Health Services and Caregiver Support
- Support 217 victims from escaping domestic violence and housing them in a safe place
- Provide over 100 protective orders to those in a domestic violence relationship
- Offer mental health services to adults and children in the community
- Provide free direct legal services estimated at \$130,000 to low-income and vulnerable Oklahomans in our region
- Spay and neuter 1,752 animals
- Provide over 103 volunteer hours of emergency childcare for families in need
- Provide 500 citizens with free medical care to those lacking health insurance or other health coverage
- Provide equine-assisted mental health services to 28 adults or children in the community
- Provide 25 clients with continual Adult Day Health services
- Provide 85 youths with emergency shelter, crisis intervention, and counseling
